Dear Friends,

I'm glad to be able to share with you some news from Sylvia about the Kakrao project. I think you'll be able to see just how passionate she is about her work and just what a difference the team are making there. Please be encouraged that your prayers do make a difference, and that you are helping to transform this community in Kakrao.

New from Sylvia

I now feel even more motivated to work with communities living in the condition that Caren was living in, knowing I can help change their feeling of hopelessness. I'm inspired, as I'm always witnessing the step by step change that is occurring in their lives.

It's also really encouraging that all the changes we planned for are already taking effect. The farmers have received training on sustainable agriculture, animal husbandry and social development. They're already using the knowledge and skills to produce more food on their farms that were neglected and seen as unproductive.

It is very encouraging that Send a Cow has now become a household name in the Kakrao community and more farmers, some of whom were not selected as beneficiaries, are adopting the training that we provide.

We are so happy and enthusiastic about our work as we're walking every step with Caren, and others, to improve their lives. Hamisi Hassan, SAC Project Facilitator in Kakrao, tells us:

"Every time I go back to visit after each training, I find that a farmer has put into use the knowledge and skills I passed on. I feel that the work I am doing is very much appreciated and it gives me the spirit to do more and more!"



Water update

I've mentioned to you before that we're launching a spring capping project in Kakrao. This is in response to the great need we've seen in the community. We know that Caren, and others in her community, are collecting water that is not fit to be consumed and so we've enhanced the project to deal with this issue. We'll be working with the community to build protected springs. They need to be protected from the animals, and they will need to learn how to maintain the spring. This will benefit not just our farmers, but all those in and around the area. Please do pray for this project.

- Please pray that more and more people, who are not part of the project, will continue to embrace the training they have picked up from our farmers. Pray that this project will have a wider and greater impact on the Kakrao community.
- We would also ask you to continue praying for our team in Kakrao, that they will continue to be passionate about working with farmers in very remote villages.
- Please pray for the new Spring Capping project, that there would be enough funding to allow this to progress and that as many people as possible will benefit from having clean water.
- Thank god for the wonderful enthusiasm of Sylvia, Hamisi and the rest of the team. Pray his continued blessing on them.
